The RYLA Programme

Rotary International is a worldwide organization of more than 1.2 million business, professional and community leaders. There are over 33,000 Rotary Clubs in more than 200 countries and territories. Rotary's main objective is service – in the community, in the workplace and throughout the world.

The Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) programme started in Brisbane, Australia in 1961. It is a Rotary International programme that facilitates intensive training for youth and young adults ages 14 to 30 years old. Talented young people attend a seminar, camp or workshop organised by Rotarians at the local or district level.

Each year more than 9,000 young people are sponsored by Rotary Clubs throughout the world. Rotary Clubs are dedicated to helping our leaders of tomorrow develop their leadership skills to the fullest. Those who complete the RYLA program are better able to successfully manage their own lives and careers and make a difference in the world.

Through this youth leadership training programme (RYLA) participants develop personal and leadership skills, gain exposure to a variety of issues, exchange ideas with their peers from different cultural backgrounds, learn how to co-ordinate community service projects, discuss approaches to resolving social and professional conflicts, meet Rotary community leaders and learn about other Rotary programmes for young people while having fun, making new friends and creating memories that will last a lifetime.

Dedicated Rotarians make up the all volunteer staff and faculty. Professional trainers are also included in the leadership staff at each session. District 7030 conducts a RYLA Conference once per year in one of the countries/territories in the District.



RYLA CONFERENCE PARTICIPANT CRITERIA

1. Demonstrated or potential leadership at school, work or community organization.
2. Ability to make moral decisions; knowing right from wrong.
3. Willingness to participate in group activities.
4. Be informed about current events; local, regional and international.
5. Willingness to express one's thoughts in front of an audience.
6. Good performance at school or work.

Each Rotary Club's RYLA Committee is responsible for conducting interviews of prospective participants, selecting participants, collecting all required paperwork from the participants.

Once a participant has been selected Registration, Medical Release and Conference Rules of Conduct Forms must be completed and submitted with a clear copy of the participant's medical insurance card to the RYLA St Kitts Nevis 2010 Secretariat.

RYLA 2010 Rules Of Conduct

Participants attending RYLA 2010 **MUST** agree to abide by the following:

1. May not leave the Conference locations or hotel **AT ANY TIME** during the Conference except in an emergency when you will be accompanied by a parent or a Conference representative.
2. May not use the hotel telephones for outgoing calls. They are for incoming calls only. If there is any need to call home, please arrange with one of the chaperones. **Cellular telephone use is NOT permitted during the instruction sessions.**
3. Possession or use of drugs, alcoholic beverages or other stimulants are **STRICTLY FORBIDDEN** at all of the Conference locations.
4. Will be assigned a room and a room-mate and may not make any changes without the permission of the Secretariat Staff.
5. Each participant must be in his/her assigned room and may not leave room after curfew. Co-ed rooms are **NOT** allowed. Male and female participants will have separate accommodation.
6. Each participant must wear his/her name tag **AT ALL TIMES.**
7. Participants must attend **ALL** scheduled activities and must stay in areas designated for Conference use.
8. Any violation of the above regulations will result in dismissal from Conference of which parents will be notified.
9. Dress code for Opening and Closing Ceremonies, and evening events each day will be casual elegance. Dress code for workshop and field events will be casual with emphasis on sobriety and modesty and including RYLA t/shirts, where provided.

Important: Your local Rotary Club is responsible for collecting all required paperwork from participants and submitting with payment to the RYLA Conference Secretariat by the established deadline.
